Project teams are asked, if possible, to attend for all sessions to enable any potential opportunities for collaboration to be identified, and to reduce any overlap between those projects that are funded.

Each project team is asked to prepare a presentation of NOT MORE than 15 minutes. Following the presentation, the project teams will take questions from the international review panel and the audience.

3. How will you go about it? 5 minutes max

4. Focus on impact and sustainability 3 minutes max

The template for impact of the project that will have to be completed at the end of the project is attached. Briefly outline your initial thoughts on how you think the project team will measure the impact of their project and ensure sustainability beyond the funded phase (3 mins max).

- 3. How will your project be mainstreamed and be sustainable? 4 minutes max
- 4. How will you go about it? 3 minutes max
- 4. What national impact will your project have? 2 minutes max

IMPORTANT: Project Type 4s will only be funded if they clearly build on an existing project, have significant national impact, will be sustainable and mainstreamed at the end of the project.
